The Neuroethics Program is proud to announce *Neuroethics Travel Awards* open to graduate and undergraduate students in any discipline who will be presenting work at a conference that discusses topics at the intersection of neuroscience and ethics.

Sponsored by the Emory Center for Ethics and the Neuroethics Program, and funded by the Emory Neurosciences Initiative, the Neuroethics Travel Award provides support from \$100-\$250 for Emory graduate and undergraduate students to travel to a conference.

Support:

The Neuroethics Travel Award will provide up to \$250 per student to defray costs for conference travel and attendance.

Eligibility:

- Applicants must be current Emory University undergraduate or graduate students.
- Students must be presenting a topic related to neuroethics at a conference/symposium.
- Students must be an author/presenter of the work.

To apply applicant must submit:

1. Travel Award Application Form
2. Conference Abstract/Presentation and confirmation of abstract acceptance
3. Curriculum vitae
